Plans are coming together for the Hamilton meeting with hybrid elements. Many thanks to all those who have submitted an abstract; we have some really great contributions and the program is shaping up nicely. We will post a preliminary program by September 7<sup>th</sup>.

We know that the uncertainties generated by COVID are a worry for many of you. In making our plans we have gone for options with the greatest flexibility and have extended the deadline for both in-person and virtual posters. The **new** deadline for posters is 30<sup>th</sup> August 2021.

In-person presenters will have the opportunity to upload a copy of their poster to Gather so it is available throughout the conference and can be seen by those attending virtually.

Some of those who have submitted virtual posters have let us know that they do hope to make it to Hamilton. We are working on a 'top-up' fee that can be paid to cover costs we incur at the Sheraton (such as the all-important coffee breaks). Be assured that the plans in place mean that those who upload posters to Gather will still be able to take part in the dedicated Q&A session for the poster session they were allocated to (via Zoom). We aim to time these sessions so those at the in-person events can attend without missing too much.

The Sheraton Hamilton hotel is working hard at mitigating the impact of COVID on proceedings. The regular cancellation policy is 48 hours, but at the moment this is down to 24 hours during COVID. So, anyone can cancel before 24 hours prior to arrival without penalty.
